COMMUNITY

The Strength of Community in the Face of COVID

The 2019-2020 year at the Rady JCC has been different than any other year we have seen before throughout our 101-year existence. The ongoing impact of the pandemic was felt throughout all areas of Rady. Even though we faced extremely uncertain and dark times, the shining light of our community members, our staff, and our volunteers lit our path forward.







PROGRAMMING

While we began our 2019-2020 year coming together to celebrate at our 100-year Nostalgia Weekend, because of the pandemic we ended our year apart. In March, we were forced to cancel all cultural programming to do our part to help curb the pandemic.



Prior to March, we were able to run some of our ongoing annual programs that our community members look forward to every year. Some of our highlighted programing included Tarbut–Festival of Jewish Culture, Music 'N' Mavens, and the Izzy Asper Jazz Series. During the summer, we ran an extremely successful Rady JCC Summer Day Camps program with proper safety measures in place. We saw over 1000 children, many who were first timers, take part.

Once the pandemic hit, we pivoted and ran several virtual programs online, with many community members taking part.

As we look ahead to next year, we will continue to pivot to be able to offer ongoing cultural programming.



EARLY LEARNING CENTRES

One of our shining lights during the ongoing pandemic in 2019-2020 was our Rady JCC Early Learning Centres. Both the Kaufman Child Care Centre and David and Ruth Asper Early Learning Centre were approved to provide care for children of essential front-line and critical workers during Phase One of the province's COVID-19 response.





The Rady Before and
After School Program at
Brock Corydon School was
reinstated when the schools
reopened last September
supporting more than 30
children and in partnership
with the school.

Both centres provided care for up to 100 children from our community as well as the community-at-large. They ran at full capacity and with strict measures of sanitation from the end of March, when we were forced to close our doors to the rest of our facility. Children in the school age program received individualized support on virtual learning. More than 20 educators committed to work during this difficult time.



FITNESS AND HEALTH



While our membership numbers decreased substantially as a result of the pandemic, we continue to tell our community that when they are ready to return to the Rady, we will be here

ready to welcome them back.



In March, the Rady JCC was forced to close its doors to its fitness and aquatics facilities for 91 days in an effort to help curb the pandemic. While our fitness and aquatic centre closed and our in-person programming and classes were cancelled, we needed to find a way to stay relevant with our members as well as to ensure our members could still interact and engage with Rady.



To solve this, we launched Rady JCC Virtual Connect: an online collection of links and resources to fitness classes, health resources, and activities. These resources were updated regularly and were extremely well-received by our members and community. Our Rady staff, trainers, and instructors volunteered their time to film tutorials, classes, and workouts to be shared.

When we were able to reopen our doors to our facility in June, we did so with proper physical distancing and safety measures in place. This included new capacity limits on our fitness floor, group classes, and pool. We worked closely with the province, ensuring the Rady would be a safe and welcoming place for our members who made the decision to return.

AWARDS

Ken H. Kronson Awards

Our volunteer excellence awards were named to pay tribute to Ken Kronson^z", who gave so much of his time, talent, and enthusiasm to the Rady JCC. The winners of these awards, much like Ken, symbolize the values of the Rady JCC and the impact we aim to make together in the community.

Every year, awards are given in the following categories: Cultural Arts; Early Learning; Engagement; Folklorama; Inclusion; Seniors; Sports Dinner; and Youth.

Due to the impact the pandemic has had on the Rady JCC, we will not be awarding these prestigious awards in 2019-2020. Please note we plan to award them once again next year.

Sid Slonim Award

This award is named in memory of Sid Slonim^{z"}, a long-time member of the Rady JCC and previously YMHA. Sid symbolized the values of the Rady JCC, bringing people together through their participation at the Rady.

Due to the impact the pandemic has had on the Rady JCC, we will not be awarding this prestigious award in 2019-2020. Please note we plan to give out the Sid Slonim Award once again next year.

Report of the Independent Auditors on the Summary Financial Statements

Opinion

Jewish Community Centre of Winnipeg, Inc. (the "Organization") for the year ended August 31, 2020.

In our opinion, the summary financial statements are a fair summary of the audited financial statements, on the basis described in the *Management's Responsibility for the Summary Financial Statements* section of our report. However, the summary financial statements are misstated to the equivalent extent as the audited financial statements of the Organization for the year ended August 31, 2020.

Summary Financial Statements

The summary financial statements do not contain all the disclosures required by Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. Reading the summary financial statements and the auditors' report thereon, therefore, is not a substitute for reading the audited financial statements and the auditors' report thereon.

The Audited Financial Statements and Our Report Thereon

In our report dated November 23, 2020, we expressed a qualified audit opinion on the audited financial statements because we were not able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding the completeness of revenue from contributions and fundraising activities.

Management is responsible for the preparation of a summary of the audited financial statements on the following basis:

The summary financial statements include the major totals and subtotals from the related complete financial statements dealing with matters having a pervasive or otherwise significant effect on the summary financial statements.


Auditors' Responsibility
