





Buildings are built one brick at a time. Lives well-lived are built one day at a time. And great legacies are built one generation at a time.

In 1912, Russian immigrant Aaron Akman began constructing single family homes in Winnipeg's North End. He believed that for his company to succeed. the core of its foundation needed to be built on three values: integrity, collaboration, and commitment.

Unbeknownst to Aaron, over the next 113 years Akman Construction's project portfolio would grow to include luxury apartments, condominiums, commercial and institutional facilities as well as post-secondary educational facilities. Time and time again, this local family-run business has successfully executed high quality building throughout Manitoba, all built on the foundation of Aaron's core company values.



Tonight, we honour community-forward business leader Jared Akman and pay tribute to the Akman Construction legacy.



Born in Russia in 1880, Aaron came to Canada in 1903 and settled at Winnipeg the following year. In 1912, he founded and was President of A. Akman and Son Limited and started building homes in Winnipeg's North End.

As a certified carpenter, Aaron's dedication to pride in workmanship and attention to detail helped develop the company's reputation for delivering quality projects to satisfied clients.

He was active in construction and real estate development, erecting many buildings around the city.

Aaron was married to Sarah Kaplan and they had four children: Esther Akman (married to Charles Swartz), Abram "Lefty" Akman (married to Beatrice "Betty" Wolch), Annette "Anna" Akman (married to Abraham Averbach), and Bertha Akman (married to Morris Rusen).

In 1962, Aaron sadly passed away. He was commemorated by an engineering scholarship at the University of Manitoba.

Born the same year Aaron started the family business, Lefty's first job was in the garment industry. He then worked as a public adjuster before joining his dad in 1942 at, what was then still called A. Akman and Son. Together they built houses and apartment buildings around the city.

Four years before joining his dad, Lefty married Beatrice Wolch, whom everyone affectionately called Betty. They had had a daughter, Beth, and three sons, Bob, Danny, and Richie.

Lefty would eventually assume the head role of the father-and-son business. At this point, the company grew impressively, constructing industrial buildings, factories, shopping centres, and condominiums.

The company grew and diversified under Lefty's leadership. In 1976, all three of Lefty's sons were active in the family business, now comprised of

three divisions: Development, Construction, and Property Management.

Notable projects under Lefty's leadership include a number

of residential homes and apartment buildings throughout Winnipeg, including Hampton Green and Hampton Park, and 1800 Wellington Crescent. He also built the four-storey walk-up that houses the Akman head offices at 346 Broadway.

Throughout his tenure, Lefty upheld his father's core values while instilling them into his sons' business acumen. He continued the company's success through the latter half of the twentieth century.

Lefty would go on to receive a City of Winnipeg Community Service Award in 1988.

We lost Lefty in 1996. His storied legacy continues to be cherished by his family, friends, and contemporaries.

Jared was born in 1984, growing up in South end of the City where he attended Ramah Hebrew School, Laidlaw Elementary, and St. Paul's High School.



He started as a Junior Project Manager in 2008 upon graduating. In 2014, Jared joined Akman Construction's leadership team as the Director of Operations, immediately earning a reputation for a strong work ethic, attention to detail, and a steadfast belief in sustainable building.

For projects to be deemed sustainable, they are ranked through the Canada Green Building Council's LEED certification. LEED (Leadership in Energy an Environment Design) certification is a symbol of sustainability excellence, used to recognize and encourage best practices in building design, construction, and operation.

Jared takes great pride in close working relationships with Clients, Consultants, and the trades which he has formed trusting relationships with the industry. Jared is also highly committed to strengthening his company's relationship with the Indigenous Community through various strategies. During the build of RRC Polytech's Manitou a bi Bii daziigae, Jared created an Indigenous Employment Strategy. This ensured 20% of all workers were to be of Indigenous decent. In fact, Jared went beyond that, estimating 45% Indigenous participation, as well as offering training, support, and mentorship for those on site. He would then assist these individuals in obtaining their career goals by partnering them with their desired trades in various positions.

Under Jared's leadership, Congregation Shaarey Zedek, one of Winnipeg's synagogues, as well as Ches Chel Emes, a non-profit burial society mandated to prepare Jewish people for burial according to tradition, underwent massive renovations. Understanding the importance and roles these sacred buildings play for our Jewish Community,



In 2015, Jared married his wife, Leanne (daughter of Harriett and Alex Zimmer). Together, they have two children, Julie born in 2018, and Hannah, born in 2020. They are currently raising their girls in Jared's dad's childhood home in River Heights.

Jared also volunteers his time and expertise sitting on a number of Boards and Committees, including leadership roles with the Jewish Federation of Winnipeg as well as the Asper Jewish Community Campus. He is also a founding Board Member and Past Vice-Chair of Young Construction Leaders of Manitoba.

Like his father, Richie, Jared is a family man, first and foremost. He and Leanne have a beautiful relationship, and his girls are his world. A QUICK HISTORY OF THE AMAZING RADY JCC KEN KRONSON SPORTS DINNER

While I haven't been to all 50 Rady JCC/Y Sports Dinners, I think I've been to every one since 1979, when baseball legends Mickey Mantle, Billy Martin, and Whitey Ford spoke at the annual fundraising dinner. My uncle Julius Wise took me to that dinner—and several others after that. It was always a highlight for me to see and hear from sports legends.

Looking back at the history of the Sports Dinner, the YMHA—and later the Rady JCC—have brought in some of the greatest athletes and sports personalities in the world. These include Jesse Owens, Frank Gifford, Terry Bradshaw, Johnny Bench, Bob Costas, Mike Ditka, Jim Valvano, Sparky Anderson, Hurricane Carter, Phil Esposito, Scotty Bowman, Pete Rose, Peyton Manning, Warren Moon, Joe Montana, Magic Johnson, and Alex Rodriguez.

The late, great Ken Kronson used to tell the story that the old downtown YMHA was short on basketballs, so he, a few friends, and Les Marks (then the Executive Director of the Y) organized the very first dinner to raise money to buy sports equipment. Kenny and his close friend Ernie Nairn founded the

YMHA Sportsman's Dinner in 1972, and Ken decided they would aim high and ask Don Shula, coach of the Super Bowl Champion Miami Dolphins, to speak at the dinner. Ken called the Dolphins' office, a man answered, and Ken asked to speak to Don Shula. The fellow on the other end said, "That's me"—and the two of them negotiated the contract right then and there. How times have changed! Today, you'd need an agent to talk to another agent, and it would go back and forth for months.

The original dinner committee included Ken Kronson, Ernie Nairn, Ken Einhorn, Paul Nusgart, Ken Galanchuk, and a few of their buddies. The dinners featured some great speakers and, for many years, made a profit of around \$60,000. It was a lot of work for what wasn't a huge return. After the 2007 dinner, the late Harold Buchwald met with a small group of us to talk about how to make the dinner more successful. Harold said we either needed to bring in bigger-name sports personalities or find another way to fundraise. The committee decided to go for it. We paid more than we ever had before and brought in legendary sports announcer Chris Berman for the 2008 dinner. Berman was fantastic. We sold more corporate sponsorships than ever, the dinner sold out, and we made over \$100,000!

In 2009, the committee swung for the fences and brought in Peyton Manning, who had just won the Super Bowl as quarterback of the Indianapolis Colts in 2007. Manning was the biggest name in football at the time, and we were incredibly fortunate to have him speak at our dinner.

Peyton opened the door for other elite athletes to follow—Cal Ripken Jr., Joe Montana, Mark Messier, Drew Brees, Dan Marino, Eli Manning, and Alex Rodriguez (A-Rod) all came to Winnipeg. The Rady JCC Sports Dinner became the premier sports dinner in Canada.

In 2014, we paid a huge fee to bring in Magic Johnson—and he sold out the dinner. During the sports auction, he gave away two separate sets of his courtside seats to any Lakers game of the winners' choosing. The two highest bidders got amazing tickets, and Magic's generosity nearly paid off his speaker's fee. Incredible!

In 2017, Teemu Selanne was the keynote speaker. After the dinner at the Winnipeg Convention Centre, a few of us went next door to a private lounge in the Delta Hotel and watched his former team, the Anaheim Ducks, in a playoff game. It was pretty cool to hang out with Teemu that night.

Ken Kronson incredibly chaired the Sports Dinner for 40 years. Many of the committee members stayed on for years, and for a long time, a small group of us would go to the Rae & Jerry's lounge for steak sandwiches after our meetings. That's where the real meetings happened.

Ken stepped down as Chair in 2012, and Blair Worb took over until 2019. Since then, Al Greenberg has chaired the committee. Sadly, Ken Kronson passed away on February 6, 2017. During his involvement, the dinner raised over \$7 million!

The Sports Dinner has grown and become more profitable thanks to live auctions offering some incredible products and experiences. Several years ago, the Vickar Automotive Group began donating a car to the event, which has raised a lot of money over the years.

At the dinner, the Rady JCC also encourages donations to help send kids to summer camp. Many kids have had the chance to go to camp thanks to the generosity of our donors.

The 2025 dinner will mark the 51st Sports Dinner. This year's featured speakers are football legends Cris Carter and John Randle, and the Akman family will be honoured. The dinner is now officially called the Rady JCC Ken Kronson Sports Dinner, named after the man who did so much for Winnipeg's Jewish community. Ken's legacy lives on, and today's staff—led by CEO Rob Berkowits—and volunteers—led by Al Greenberg—continue to produce an outstanding event that raises much-needed funds.

These funds help kids become Rady members, attend cultural programs, and go to summer camp. Seniors, people with disabilities, and those who can't afford memberships are also provided with support and access to programs they wouldn't otherwise have.

The first 50 Sports Dinners have made a huge difference in our community, and I'm confident the next 50 will be just as impactful.

2025 KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

John Randle

Pro Football Hall-of-Famer | Former NFL Defensive Tackle

A humble man from humble beginnings, John Randle grew up in tiny, Mumford, Texas to become a legendary defensive lineman for the Minnesota Vikings and Seattle Seahawks, rising to become enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

His National Football League (NFL) career began after being selected as an undrafted "free agent" from Division II Texas A & I by the Minnesota Vikings. He dominated the 1990s, being named to six All-Pro First teams, the NFL's 1990s All-Decade Team, and earning seven trips to the Pro Bowl. Randle's 137.5 career sacks rank tenth all-time and first among defensive tackles. During his fourteen-year NFL, Randle was known for his high-energy style, earning the respect of both his teammates and opponents.

In 2008, John was inducted into the College Hall of Fame and in 2010 he became the 258th member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Randle achieved the pinnacle of football excellence in 2019, when he was named to the NFL 100 All-Time Team.

In retirement, Randle has found that his passion and commitment to the game of football continues by working with the "legends" of the game. He proudly serves as the Director of the North Central at the NFL Legends Community, an organization that assists former players as they make the transition from the field to retirement.

Cris Carter

Pro Football Hall-of-Famer | NFL Analyst | Author

Cris Carter is a former *NFL* wide receiver for the *Philadelphia Eagles*, *Minnesota Vikings* and *Miami Dolphins*. Over the course of his sixteen seasons (1987-2002), Cris was named to eight *Pro Bowls*, was twice named first-team *All-Pro*, and was voted into the *Pro Football Hall of Fame* in 2013. In college, Cris starred at *Ohio State*, where he was a consensus *All-American* after his junior season.


After retiring with the second-most receptions and touchdowns as a receiver in the history of the NFL, Cris entered the media. He was a studio analyst for *HBO*'s "Inside the NFL" from 2002-2007. From 2008-2016, Cris served as a studio analyst on *ESPN*'s signature football shows, "Sunday NFL Countdown" and "Monday Night Countdown."

Cris was also a regular co-host on *ESPN*'s top-rated radio show, *Mike and Mike*, and was an analyst on *ESPN*'s *Super Bowl* and *NFL Draft* coverage.

Most recently, Cris served as a co-host on Fox Sports 1's daily morning show, First Things First, where he debated the hottest topics in sports.

Cris is the author of *Going Deep*, published in 2013, which examines the evolution of the wide receiver position.

Cris is also a soughtafter public speaker and has spoken for many Fortune 500 companies. Cris speaks about leadership, teamwork, and overcoming adversity, including his previous struggles with addiction.

This year's Max Labovitch Ice Hockey Scholarship winner has truly been playing the game since he could walk. Michael Markhasin learned to skate at age two and was playing with the South Winnipeg Hockey Association as soon as he turned four. At age 7, he qualified for the Team Manitoba U11 squad and went on to win gold at the biggest U11 tournament in the province. That win was Team Manitoba's first gold in 20 years!

Michael continued to work on his skills year-round at the rink, with the goal of getting a spot on the Manitoba Brick team. Although the team had a cutoff at 9 years-old, they accepted 8-year-old Michael and he went on to a great season and held his own on the ice even against bigger 11-year-old players. At the end of the season, Michael was invited to participate in an all-star tournament with the top 100 players in Western

Canada. Michael ultimately went on to take third place!

Michael currently attends Gray Academy, along with his older brother, Nikita, and looks forward to continuing to excel on and off the ice.

2025 Finalists

Adam Buchwald
Long Track Speed Skating
Since first making his mark on the speed skating world in 2022 with four first place finishes in provincial championships, Adam Buchwald has been on a steady trajectory towards his

This past year, adversity reared its head and threatened to derail Adam's dreams, but he persevered. Adam started the 2024/2025 season as usual in May of 2024 and training was going well when he began suffering from episodes of



Olympic goals.

increased heart rate. After the third occurrence of a heart rate exceeding 230 beats per minute, Adam's coach (ex Winnipegger & World Speed Skating champion, Mike Ireland) paused training until a diagnosis could be found.

Adam ultimately missed 3 months of training, finally being cleared in July 2024 with a heart condition diagnosis and daily medication to keep things under control. In March of 2025, Adam underwent successful surgery to repair his heart and can now train full time again, without any medication. Despite this serious challenge, Adam still managed to compete and won third place overall in the Canadian National Junior Men's Championships in December of 2024, and was named to the Canadian Junior World Championship & Junior World Cup Team. He went on to represent Canada in Collalbo, Italy this past February, where he placed 5th overall in the Men's Team Pursuit, as well as top 15 and top 20 finishes across the 3,000 m and 5,000 m distances. Ultimately, Adam went on to become the top-rated Junior Man in Canada for the 2024/25 season in the 10,000 m category.

It is truly remarkable that Adam was able to accomplish one of his lifelong goals to represent Canada at World Championships & being named to Team Canada. There has not been a male from Manitoba on the Junior World team in over 6 years and Adam is the first Jewish male named to Team Canada's Long Track speed skating team.

Currently, Adam has recently completed his second year at University of Calgary where he is majoring in history. He trains full time at the Calgary Olympic oval High-Performance program.

Beginning with the upcoming season, Adam will now compete in the senior rankings. He is well positioned to continue his growth, and his goal is to represent Team Canada at World and Olympic Championships in the years to come.

Vadim Matveev Kyokushin Karate

It's rare that the sports we begin as children become lifelong passions, but for those who stick with it, the world begins to open up to them in new and amazing ways.

Vadim Matveev was just three years old when he began training in karate. As he grew, and advanced in the art of full-contact Kyokushin karate, Vadim discovered that the spirit of discipline and greater self-knowledge through martial arts was worth devoting all his energy to.



"I chose Kyokushin Karate because it is one of the toughest martial arts there is with a philosophy and values that strengthen you for life, and I felt it from the first year I started training at the age of 8," says Vadim.

From 2005 through 2017, he was the Israeli champion twelve times in the fight category, and the kata champion five times. At the age of 19, he received his black belt, and he opened his first dojo in Israel, bringing the joy of karate to a whole new generation.

In 2015, Vadim became the official representative of the Kyokushin KWF Organization for Israel, representing and promoting the sport across the country. This passion for the sport extends throughout his family, from his father, who introduced him to the sport, to his brothers, who currently operate 5 dojos in Israel, with around 300 active students.

Meanwhile, Vadim has continued his upward trajectory in competition. In 2023, he had a top ten finish in the Karatenomichi World Federation European Championship in Armenia, and this past January, he took first place in the Kyokushin World Union Senshi Gold Cup All America in Montreal, which qualified him for the world championship in Japan in November.


Now living in Canada, and working at the Rady JCC, Vadim continues to train and compete. He hopes to represent the Kyokushin KWF organization in his new country as he did in Israel and plans to have the strongest school in Canada within the next 5 years.

When asked what drives him, Vadim replied, "I feel it is my duty to be an example to the new generation. I know that this way I can show them that hard work always brings results. The training is not always easy or fun, but it always brings results."

Leah ShorePowerlifting

Leah Shore began her powerlifting career in May of 2023, and has already raised the bar on her goals as she finds her place in the active powerlifting community in Canada.

She competes in the Junior Women's Unequipped category, in which competitors take on bench press, squats, and deadlift without additional supportive equipment, Leah has developed a love for the sport that extends beyond personal achievement and is already giving back by serving on the Board of Directors of the Manitoba Powerlifting Association and also acts as the board's corporate secretary.



Additionally, she is a qualified Manitoba Powerlifting Referee as certified by the Canadian Powerlifting Union as well as the International Powerlifting Federation.

In 2024, Leah built on her local success when she competed at the Canadian Powerlifting Union's Western Championships in Moosejaw. Based on her performance, she qualified for a spot at the Commonwealth Powerlifting Championships in Sun City, South Africa. Competing on the world stage has only strengthened Leah's resolve to improve and she has already surpassed her tournament best in recent workouts, due in no small part to the connections she made at the event, growing Leah's community of fellow lifters and brand-new friends. In a sport like powerlifting, where one competes just as much against their own limits as they do against their fellow competitors, there is a spirit of camaraderie and cheering each other on to greater gains that keeps lifters coming back to the gym again and again.

"The commitment to building strength through nutrition, regular and constant workouts, proper sleep hygiene, accountability to yourself and others and of course a desire to lead and enjoy a healthy life is a full-time endeavour. In short, powerlifting is a discipline." ~ Sean Shore

Currently, Leah is working towards qualifying for Canadian nationals, and ultimately a place at Worlds. In the meantime, she volunteers her time with the Manitoba Powerlifting Association and participates in competitions as an athlete, as well as a coach, handler, and a referee. She's also currently pursuing certification as a national and international powerlifting referee.

When not lifting, Leah attends university and works at the Rady JCC as a nationally certified lifeguard and deck supervisor.

Janna Soronow
Competitive Cheerleading

In just 4 seasons of competitive All-Star Cheerleading with her team, Vision Cheer, Janna Soronow has quickly accumulated accolades, including Rookie of the Year in her first season.

This past year, Janna was on two international teams, Limitless – a Level 3 U16 squad, and Illusion – a Level 4 U18, as well as Enlighten, a Level 6 Developmental U16 team. In 2024, Janna was named MVP of the Limitless team.

Limitless and Illusion recently dominated the Canadian competitive scene with multiple first place finishes, including the Manitoba Winter Riot, and True North Cheer and Dance in Edmonton. The teams went on to two top ten finishes at the prestigious Cheersport Nationals competition in Atlanta, where they faced off against the best squads in the United States, with Limitless claiming a well-earned silver medal. Competing at a world-class level was transformative for Janna, who says it was one of the best experiences of her life, and it has only fueled her passion to train harder and continue competing at the elite level.

When not competing, Janna is committed to sharing her exuberance for competitive cheerleading to the next generation and has been a volunteer Junior Coach for the past 2 years for Imagine - a U8 Level 1 team. Her passion for the sport is infectious, and her students love learning from her.

Janna spends 5 days a week in the gym which works out to approximately 19 hours of training per week. Whether she is working on a new stunt, tumbling,

dancing, or coaching, Janna commits her all to the practice, and is a true performer through-andthrough.

In the offseason, Janna stays in form through strength training, trampoline work, and stunting drop-ins.

Paul Friesen - Sports Columnist, Winnipeg Sun

For 22 years and counting, Paul has been the sports columnist for the Winnipeg Sun, giving readers news and insightful commentary into the Jets, Bombers, Goldeyes and more. A lifelong Manitoban, he has covered Olympic Games, Pan-Am Games, Grey Cups, world hockey and curling championships, the PGA Championship and more Blue Bomber and Jets games than he can count. From high school to the pros, it's not about the final score for Paul. It's about the people.



Leah Hextall - Sports Broadcaster

Leah Hextall is a reporter and play-by-play announcer for ESPN, covering both NHL and NCAA games. She was the first woman to call play-by-play commentary for a nationally televised NHL game as part of Sportsnet's first all-female broadcast team. Hextall also made history as the first woman to call an NCAA Men's Ice Hockey Championship game for ESPN in 2019. Leah is also a professional public speaker, inspiring action, leadership, and inclusive thinking.



John Hindle - Entrepreneur, Former GM, Winnipeg Goldeyes

From 1994-2001, John Hindle was the general manager of the Winnipeg Goldeyes and saw increased attendance every year. In 2002 John served as a director of the Manitoba Baseball Association and in 2003 was the president of the Manitoba Junior Baseball League. He also founded the business "Home Run Sports Sporting Goods", and he introduced blastball to Manitoba.



John is now a widely acclaimed professional speaker who calls himself the Contact Hitter – someone who makes meaningful connections with people.
