Hadar Maoz: The Persian Groove

In The Ring, Israeli comedian and actor Adir Miller steps into the dramatic spotlight, delivering a moving performance based on his real-life journey. The story follows Arnon Noble, a religious man with an unbreakable bond to his Holocaustsurvivor mother, Violetta (played by **Tiki Dayan**). As her health begins to fail, Arnon and his estranged daughter travel to Hungary in search of the mysterious ring that once saved Violetta's life.

With stunning scenes set in Budapest and rich emotional layers, this multigenerational story explores memory, family, and the inherited weight of trauma — all laced with Miller's signature wit. *The Ring* is a rare blend of heartbreak and hope that lingers long after the credits roll.

This is not just a film. It's a story you feel in your bones.

Fast-paced and delightfully over the top, this is a film that blends sitcom-style mayhem with a uniquely Jewish flair. The clever writing, stellar cast, and absurd twists make Bad Shabbos a perfect night at the movies.


