Matchstalk Man**

**June 1 Lecture
Major Sonny Brown from the
Royal Canadian Air Force**

This presentation will focus on the No. 2 Construction Battalion, which was a segregated unit in the Canadian military during World War I. Formed in 1916, it was the only all-Black battalion in Canadian military history. Black men across Canada volunteered to fight, but many were rejected because of racism. After pressure from

Black communities, the government finally authorized this separate unit. After being allowed to join the Canadian military, and despite serving with courage, dedication, and resilience, this battalion faced racial discrimination from their peers, limited opportunities for advancement, as well as segregation and unequal treatment. Despite the challenges they faced, this unit holds a vital place in both Canadian and Black history, paving the way for individuals like Major Sonny Brown not only to join the Canadian Armed Forces, but to strive and succeed within it.
